House and Club Rules

DOCKAGE FEES

1. No dockage fee for members in good standing. All members and guests are required to “SIGN-IN” upon arrival.
2. *Guest Policy: One guest boat per member. Fee is \$20 per night or free, if guest applies for membership.*
3. If space is limited, visiting boats may be required to raft-up to host/member boat.
4. All guests are the responsibility of their member host, who must be in attendance during their guests’ entire stay.
5. No charge for dockage for visitors during the day unless they wish to use shore power (use some common sense).

CRUISE-INS

1. *See Cruise-In Policy.*

CLUBHOUSE RULES

1. All supplies in the clubhouse storeroom are to be used for the Club’s operations and events only.
2. Members and guests using the galley must clean it up, including the stove and oven. Take your leftovers from the refrigerator with you.
3. All packages in the freezer must be marked and dated. No packages allowed for more than sixty (60) days. NO fish bait allowed in the refrigerator or freezer...it will be dumped!
4. All members and guests must remove their personal garbage from the club. Empty cans are to be crushed (NO dumping in the river).

PETS

1. Pets are not allowed in the Clubhouse at any time.
2. Pets are to be kept on their owner’s boat at all times except for the “call of nature” when they are to be escorted on leash directly to and from the pet area. Owners must clean up after pets.
3. Pets should not be a disturbance to other members; this includes barking. Pet owners must effectively abate any and all disturbances immediately.

ELECTRICAL AND WATER CONNECTIONS

1. Electrical connections are 30 amp/twist lock. Two cords are allowed if it does not affect or interfere with a single hook-up.
2. **WATER IS NOT POTABLE.** Do not hook up your boat or fill your water tanks. Bring your own water for your needs.

DOCKING

1. Members may tie-up at any available space. Please use common sense during periods of heavy use, so that the next boat can dock with a minimum of problems. Members should be aware that the gazebo was not built to withstand the stress of docking large boats.
2. On function weekends, the west-end of the clubhouse is reserved for host vessels. The rear commodore or other officer in charge will assign dock space as needed. If the rear commodore is not present, the duty falls to the most senior flag officer, followed by the staff commodore followed by the most senior director. You may be required to stern-in, bow-in or raft up as conditions require. The rear commodore or other officer in charge will make decisions based on knowledge of who has made reservations to attend the function and will attempt to accommodate special requirements. Larger boats will have priority to space in front of the long dock. There are thirty-one 30 amp twist lock receptacles. Some boats may have to share power or be without power.
3. Member boats have priority to space available. Guest boats will be assigned space by the rear commodore or other officer in charge.

RESERVATION GUIDELINES FOR FUNCTIONS

Under the supervision of the vice commodore,

1. Member reservations will be on a first come, first served basis. Hosts should keep track.
2. Reservations, including payment and any request for guest docking (maximum of one per member), must be received by the deadline date. A separate check for guest docking is recommended.
3. The deadline date should be no less than 10 days prior to the function.
4. Promptly after the deadline date, the **rear commodore** will notify members as to the status of their request for guest docking and/or if there is an issue with power or space. Any fees collected for members/guests who decide not to attend at this point will be returned.

RADIO AND TELEVISION

1. Do not play either one so loudly as to disturb other members. Background music may be played on the patio or elsewhere, unless it disturbs other members.

GENERAL DO'S AND DON'TS

DO learn the opening and lock-up routines.

DON'T expect someone else to clean up after you.

DO take the time to inspect the systems and their operation.

DON'T assume everything is working properly. Check it out.

DO enjoy the Club. USE IT, DON'T ABUSE IT.

DO respect other members' privacy.

DON'T hesitate to alert a flag officer or Board member to a problem.

DO come often, stay as long as you like. But, be prepared to share in the upkeep and maintenance of our club.
